### Statistics

- Five stories tall and one quarter mile long
- 1,050 student spaces
- Home to the Campus Café, COMPASS, Inter-Residence Hall Council (IRHC), Wadsworth Hall Student Association (WWSA), and WMTU radio station
- The only residence hall with wardrobe storage space instead of closets
- Recently renovated in 2005 for \$33 million
- Relaxation areas include a game room, fitness center, and sauna

### Home to Thirty Houses

All of the residence halls at Michigan Tech are divided into house sections. Each house is a community with a name, history, and unique identity for students to build friendships, participate in social events, and achieve success.

### Resident Assistant (RA)

Each house is staffed by an RA who is trained to help residents adjust to college, to be a resource for answers to questions, and maintain an atmosphere in the house which is conducive to studying while helping to build a strong social community.
